MY STORY

Where have you experienced jealousy on your journey?

What do you do when you think someone might be jealous towards you?

Have you ever been surprised when you've realized you've been jealous of someone? How have you handled that temptation to be jealous?

GOING DEEPER

All of us have experienced jealousy to some degree. Sometimes it's directed towards us and other times we're jealous toward others.

Read the following verses and write down how Jesus responds to jealousy when it's revealed in his followers:

Luke 10:38-41

Mark 10:35-45

John 21:18-22

1 Corinthians 3:1-3 tells us that jealousy and dissension are two markers that show us we're still immature followers of Jesus.

Read the following passages and write down what can help you when tempted to be jealous.

Luke 6:41-42

Romans 12:14-21

TAKING IT HOME

So much about jealousy centers on insecurity about our identity. We have in our minds who we think we are and often have difficulty trusting who God says we are.

Take a risk... Each day this week read a passage exploring who God says you are. Think on God's word for a while and decide to believe!

Monday: 2 Corinthians 5:17 – *I am a new person.*

Tuesday: John 1:12 – *I am a child of God.*

Wednesday: Ephesians 1:7 – *I am free & forgiven.*

Thursday: Ephesians 2:10 – *I am God's masterpiece.*

Friday: John 15:15 – *I am a friend of Jesus.*

Saturday: Romans 12:3-8 – *I have a gift to share as a part of Christ.*

Sunday: Matthew 5:14-16 – *I am the light of the world!*
