A foundation of understanding: Conviction vs. Condemnation

Romans 4:7, 8, 5:1, 7:17, 20 ; Isaiah 54:17; John 3:18, 19, 5:24; Galatians 3:13

- Conviction-From the Holy Spirit to show us what is wrong and lead us to God
- Condemnation-From Satan to accuse, destroy, imprison us.

Breaking agreements with the enemy

John 8:44; Genesis 3:1; Ephesians 4:26-27; Romans 8:1-2

- <u>Confess</u> the agreement.
- Repent.
- · Listen as God speaks truth into my life.
