Matthew 1:21-23; Isaiah 7:14; Revelation 1:8

Luke 1:28; 2 Corinthians 1:3-7; Joshua 1:9

DIGGING DEEPER

Read Matthew 1:18-25. This passage describes the birth of Jesus and explains the meaning of his name, which is God with us.

What do you think causes you to sometimes feel distant from God?

In what ways have you experienced God with you?

Matthew 1:23; Matthew 28:16-20; Philippians 3:20-21

Today we celebrate God's presence here and now, His faithfulness to us in the past and trust him with our future... He is Emmanuel. Read Luke 1:28, Genesis 39:21 and Romans 8:35-39. These verses show us that God is with you, God was with you and God will always be with you.

How do you need God's presence to help you in enduring whatever difficult circumstances you may be facing today?

- Ask God to make His presence known to you during those times that He feels distant to you.
- Pray for those you know that need to experience God in their life. Ask God to make His presence known to them.

Old Testament Prophesies fulfilled in the New Testament

Below is a chart of just a few of the prophesies about Jesus (some written nearly 1,000 yrs. before his birth). God is completely faithful and we can trust Him with our present and future!

- 1. Jesus is to come from a specific Jewish tribe (Judah) in the town of Bethlehem
 - Prophesied: Micah 5:2
 - Fulfilled: Luke 2:4-7 & 3:33
- 2. He would be born in the House of King David
 - Prophesied: Jeremiah 23:5-6
 - Fulfilled: Luke 3:31
- 3. He would be born into the family of Jesse (David's Dad)
 - Prophesied: Isaiah 11:1
 - Fulfilled: Luke 3:32
- 4. He would be born of a virgin
 - Prophesied: Isaiah 7:14
 - Fulfilled: Matthew 1:18
- 5. He would be worshipped by Kings and shepherds and given gifts
 - Prophesied: Psalm 72:9-10
 - Fulfilled: Matthew 2:11 & Luke 2:9
- 6. Jesus would be born at a time when mothers mourned for their children who were killed.
 - Prophesied: Jeremiah 31:15
 - Fulfilled: Matthew 2:16-18
- 7. Jesus' family would have to flee to Egypt
 - Prophesied: Hosea 11:1
 - Fulfilled: Matthew 2:13-14
- 8. He will be called Lord
 - Prophesied: Psalm 110:1
 - Fulfilled: Luke 2:11
