### Don't be discouraged

Mark 13:9-13; John 14:26; Acts 4:8; John 13:1; Romans 8:35-38; John 10:27-29; Romans 8:29-34

• It's Him, not you.

### What we need to do in the meantime:

- Stand firm.
  Luke 21:16-19; James 4:7 & 1 Peter 5:9-10; 2 Timothy 2:22
- Keep doing the next right thing.

## My intentional momentum:

### **NEXT STEPS**

Waiting is hard and not knowing what will happen next can elicit a variety of responses in us. In Mark 13, Jesus answers some questions about the future, both near and far off, but above all he encourages an attitude we all need to develop.

- **1.** Why do you think so many of us have such a fascination with the future?
- **2.** Have you ever found yourself or been around others who are getting pulled into thinking there's a chance Jesus will return on a certain date? If so, what was the response after it didn't happen?

- **1.** Read Mark: 5–13. How would Jesus' warnings and encouragements have helped the disciples in the early years of the church?
- **2.** What relevance do these warnings and encouragements have for us today?

**3.** How would Mark 13:26–27 encourage those who have experienced the distress/trouble preceding Jesus' return?

How do the following verses help you understand what it means to have a healthy fear (respect, awe) of God as opposed to a fear that paralyzes us or causes us to live in worry or dread?
