God hears you when you call out.

Jesus tells us that He will be with us always in Matthew 28:19-20. How could the ongoing knowledge of God's constant presence make a difference in our attitude or actions in stepping away from the average?

It's comforting to know that "God always meets us where we are" but He also doesn't want us to stay there. What help do the following verses give us to enjoy God's acceptance and patience without becoming complacent?

THE PURPOSE OF LIFE GROUPS
