DIGGING DEEPER

1. This week we saw that Paul used strong words such as "enemies" and "alienated" to describe the Colossian's spiritual condition (and ours) before they knew Christ (Colossians 1:21). How do the following verses reinforce and further describe who we are before we know Christ?
