Food for thought

Getting to know you...

Think of the most loving people you know... How do they show their love to you and others?

Can you think of a time when you saw love change another person's life? If so, how?

Digging Deeper

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus challenged a number of the common teachings of the day on such topics as prayer, anger, divorce, and love.

In Matthew 5:43-48, what misconceptions about love did Jesus address?

What motivations do you see in this passage for loving others?

What do you think it looks like in real life to love your enemy?

Wherever Jesus went, crowds flocked to Him. His response to these crowds earned Him the reputation of not only being a miracle worker but also a friend of sinners and outcasts.

Read Matthew 9:9-13 and Luke 7:36-50. What do you notice about Jesus' response to the people?

In our culture, do you think Jesus is still thought of as a friend of sinners? Why or why not?

What are one or two practical ways we can be like Jesus and show love to those we see daily? ...to those marginalized?

Can you think of anything we should stop doing to show love?

Prayer Tips:

Use these prayer tips to talk it over with God:

- Heavenly Father, I thank you for bringing me from the kingdom of darkness into your kingdom of light through the death and powerful resurrection of Jesus! Help me this week to rely on Your power at work in me so I can love my brothers and sisters more.
- Please help me today to see people in need and respond as you would want me to understanding that you have me in this place and at this time for a specific reason.
- Use the following space to list some people God is placing on your heart and how He's directing you to show them love.

THE PURPOSE OF LIFE GROUPS
