The Common Thread: There is a Holy God who lovingly pursues a relationship with His creation, Man.

## **Big Picture**

- God is Holy (good, pleasing, right) and sovereign.
- Man rebels and lives in their own way- doing what is right in their own eyes (determining good and evil for themselves).
- God continues to redirect His people back to a right path and blessing.
- Obedience to God leads to blessing.
- Disobedience leads to destruction.
- God Continues to work out His plan of restoration in spite of man's failings.
