My Story

Going Deeper

Jesus asked His followers, "Who do you say I am?" Put yourself in the story found in Mark 8:27-30 and imagine Jesus Himself asking you the same question. Read through the following verses, take some notes, explore around your Bible, and write your answer to Jesus' question below.

Who do you say Jesus is?

If you are a follower who admits Jesus is in the driver's seat, how does your life show it?

The Pharisees wanted Jesus to perform miracles for them to see, and yet their hearts were far from following Jesus. Instead of showing them a miracle, Jesus simply left. Read Matthew 15:7-9 and Matthew 23:25-28 for reactions Jesus had to some of these religious leaders.

What can we learn from this?

In Matthew 20:28, Jesus gave a short description of His purpose when He told his disciples that He "did not come to be served, but to serve." Since we're called to emulate Jesus, it's no surprise that we share a similar calling to serve others. What can you learn from the following verses about what it means to serve God?

- 4. Remember only <u>God</u> is worthy of worship, not yourself or other things.
