# **Life Group Questions**

### For week of March 9th

#### **MY STORY**

How do you think the average person would respond to the statement, "When you decide to follow Jesus, the Holy Spirit comes into you and begins to change you from the inside out"?

Can you think of a place or situation where you typically seem most tuned-in to God's Spirit guiding, speaking or encouraging you? (Examples: time alone, listening to a sermon, personal study, talking or processing with others, etc.)

### **DIGGING DEEPER**

The Holy Spirit changes us and works in our lives. Galatians 5:16-26 adds to this picture of the Holy Spirit at work. As you read this passage, can you identify a time in your life (past or recent) when the Holy Spirit was challenging you to grow and/or change in any of the areas mentioned here? If so, explain.

Most of us have encountered the pleasant surprise of benefitting from a co-worker or family member's gift or ability you had forgotten about or didn't know they had. The same can be true of the Holy Spirit. As you read the passages below, how do they remind you of, and help you understand, the role of the Holy Spirit?
