For week of April 12, 2015

In the beginning... Grace.

Genesis 1,15, & Romans 4

Turn a message into a conversation. Use these questions to have a conversation with someone about this week's message.

Have you had difficulty seeing someone receive something they didn't deserve or that you feel they didn't deserve?

Grace is <u>always</u> a <u>gift!</u>

2 Corinthians 9:14-15; Ephesians 2:1-10

What can result if this difficulty is left to fester?

Read: Genesis 4:1-8.

Cain did not like God accepting his brother Abel and his gift. What was the result?

Giving grace to others helps you <u>see</u>, <u>accept</u> and <u>believe</u> that God has grace for you!

Luke 7:36-50

Although envy may not lead you to murder, it has brought about the death of many relationships. If this has been a weakness for you, take some time right now to ask Jesus to help head this off before envy takes root in your life. Like with Cain, God desires to help your heart through the Holy Spirit.

The Elephant... It's not fair.

Matthew 20:1-16

Read: John 3:16,17

From this verse, does it sound like Jesus is more concerned about the things we do or who we believe? Why?

Ask the Lord today to help you celebrate the grace you see Him pour out on others and to recognize the grace He's given you.

Grace is the unmerited favor of God. It's always a gift that we receive. Grace is never earned!

Read: Ephesians 2:1-10

The Scriptures say before Christ we are dead. What are some other words that describe our condition before believing in Jesus?

After believing in Jesus, what is our condition through God's love?

This grace of God changes us into something new. Take a moment to describe – from this passage – our new identity in Jesus Christ:

What is a way you can show grace and kindness to others this week?
