### **Digging In**

At the core, prayer is simply having a conversation with God. Like all communication, it involves talking and listening. However a big barrier to hearing from God is our sin.

Read Psalm 139. (specifically verses 1 and 23-24)

Have you ever asked God to examine your heart to see if there are things that are offensive to him? Why or why not?

What if you considered asking a close friend or spouse to examine your life? Could such examining be a challenge? Could it be beneficial?

For David to ask this of God required relationship and trust. Take a couple minutes and ask God to examine your heart...

Jot down a few things God reveals to you through prayer and possibly share these with your group for prayer and encouragement:

How do the following verses help us move forward and grow in our ability and motivation to forgive?

Matthew 18:21-35

Colossians 3:12-14

Luke 7:36-50

Read 1 John 1:5-10.

1 John 1:9 is a key passage to understanding how we're to live in the light of Jesus through confessing our sins to him. Confession is taking what is hidden and bringing it into the light. John helps us understand that God is a safe place to shine light into the dark corners of our life.

According to this passage we read in 1 John, what does God do as we take this crucial step of confession?

What challenges do you find in forgiving others?

The Psalms are a collection of ancient songs that poetically express the experiences of people walking with God throughout ancient history.

Read Psalm 32.

Are there any parts of this Psalm that resonates with you when it comes to your experience of forgiven sin?
