#### Read Luke 6:46-49.

*Jesus' purpose for people coming to Him is to hear what He had to say and obey.* When you come to Jesus is obeying Him your desired outcome? What wisdom does He teach us from this story?

### Read Luke 6:36 & Luke 7:11-17

Jesus' teaching in chapter 6 sets the stage for the specific miracles he does in chapter 7 and compassion is a key phrase. Re-read Luke 7:13. Do you let yourself see people in need?

Does it make you uncomfortable that Jesus says we <u>must</u> have compassion? Does your compassion move you to action?

How can seeing people and showing compassion to them help us be the Church Jesus desires for us to be?

Spend some time in prayer asking God to help our hearts to "overflow with compassion" just like Jesus who we are following. Ask the Lord to help us to courageously act when we hear the Holy Spirit's prompting of our hearts with a willingness to obey.
