Share your story

What insight, question, or resolution did you discover from our time of worship together on Sunday?

Has the word "Hangry" ever been applied to you? Does being hungry ever effect your attitude? How? Is it easier to see other people's "hangry" more than your own?

Connect to God's story

Read Mark 6:30-44.

What was Jesus' response to people when they were looking for a quiet place to be alone? How did He see his huge crowd? Would you see people the same way if you were busy, tired, and hungry?

What was the disciple's response to the gathered crowd late in the day? How do you think you would respond?

Do you think this miracle would be super memorable to Jesus' followers? (Feeding thousands of people with five loaves of bread and two fish)

Read Mark 8:1-12.

What was Jesus' response when He saw this large crowd that had been with Him for three days?

What was the disciples' response? Were their eyes fixed on the problem or the Savior?

If the Pharisees had been with Jesus for the last three days to learn from Him and saw what he did with the loaves and fish would they have even asked for a sign?

Read Mark 8:13-21.

Why is it important that Jesus emphasized the abundance left over? What does this say about who He is?

Why is the attitude and heart of Jesus' followers so important to Jesus? What can happen if we let grumbling take root?

How important is it that our hearts are teachable when we come to Jesus? Are your eyes fixed on the problem or your Savior?

I had only heard about you before, but now I have seen you with my own eyes. I take back everything I said, and I sit in dust and ashes to show my repentance.
