Trust in three parts:	
1. Trust is a commitment.	
	What makes it difficult to trust people? What makes it easier to trust?
2. Trust is whole.	
Steps to acknowledging in all your ways:	What makes it difficult to trust God? What makes it easier?
Revelation → Conviction → Conflict → Confession (agreement) → Repentance → Forgiveness (restoration to right relationship) → Freedom, purpose, power, confidence.	
	Connect to God's story
3. Trust moves.	Read Proverbs 3:5-6.
	How do you trust in the Lord with all your heart? What does it take to do this?
	Why might your own understanding of things get in the way?

What does it look like for someone to acknowledge the Lord in all their ways? When is this most challenging?

Read John 6:60-71.

Why did many of Jesus' disciples turn away and desert Jesus?

How did Peter respond? From the context, do you think Peter understood what Jesus had been talking about?

What do you do when you read what Jesus is saying and you don't understand? What does Jesus say the Holy Spirit's role is in our understanding hard things?

When a betrayal of trust is revealed, how important is conviction, confession, repentance, and forgiveness to trust being restored?

Is there a relationship you have that needs restored? What is the Spirit revealing to you as your next step?
